STEP 01

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

ONLINE EXPLORER

THE CHATTERBOX

The following activity will give you a chance to learn about the ways your child enjoys chatting with friends via messaging apps and video calls.

Even if they're not allowed to use messaging apps yet, this is still a good chance to learn about what they have heard about from others or are keen to try themselves.

LET'S GET BUILDING

Start by reading the character description on the next page together (or ask your child to read it out loud). Be sure you have your bricks ready and start building.

While building your awesome creatures, here are some helpful icebreakers that will help you keep the conversation going.



Most messaging apps are meant for over 13s. If you're not sure check it out online.

BUILD AND TALK

IF YOUR CHILD USES MESSAGING APPS

- What apps do you use to stay in touch with your friends?
- Do you share photos or images with each other?

What about photos or videos you take yourself?

Do you ever chat to people you don't know? Other kids, or even grown ups


IF YOUR CHILD USES VIDEO CALLS

Who do you mainly chat to on video calls? Do you ever chat to people you don't know?

IF YOUR CHILD USES NEITHER BUT IS CURIOUS

- What messaging apps have you heard of? Tell me how [app] works?
- Do any of your friends use them?
- Why do you think they're safe for kids to use?
 What bad things do you think could happen?



WATCH OUT



READ BEFORE YOU BUILD

Kids love how messaging apps help them stay in touch with their friends, but sometimes things that have been said or shared in messages can be used against them - to bully or embarrass.

HOW DO YOU DEAL WITH THE BULLIES?

Most bullies crave attention, so it's important not to respond in the heat of the moment.

If your child experiences or witnesses bullying online, it's important they know to tell you, or another trusted grown-up, right away.

BUILD AND TALK

If your child uses a specific app, then talk about that first. If they aren't using messaging apps yet skip to question 2.

- Has anyone ever been mean to you online?
- Do you think people say things in online messages they wouldn't face-to-face? It's easy to hide behind a screen.
- Have you ever seen someone get bullied online?

If yes, how did that make you feel?
What did they do?
If no, I've heard people can be really mean.

- What if a person does something mean then said it was 'just a joke'?
- What about if they pressure you to do something you don't want to do?

If it feels wrong and you're uncomfortable don't do it.

Tell me, or another grown-up you trust like a teacher.



Most apps let you report and block people if they are being really mean.

MAKE A PACT


- Let's be kind and supportive to everyone online.
- Let's not say anything online we wouldn't say to someone's face in real life.
- Let's tell each other right away if someone's mean to us online or asks us to do something that doesn't feel right.



WATCH OUT



READ BEFORE YOU BUILD

Once something's shared online it's nearly impossible to get it back. It's important your child knows the basics of sharing safely and feel that they can come to you if they make a mistake.

WHAT IS A DIGITAL FOOTPRINT?

A digital footprint is the information about a person that exists on the internet as a result of their online activity- so any photos, public messages, comments or videos they share on social networks or any forms they fill in online.

BUILD AND TALK

If your child uses a specific app, then talk about that first. If they aren't using messaging apps yet skip to question 3.

- Do you ever share photos and videos with friends when your messaging?
 If yes, what kind of photos or videos?
 Selfies? Funny stuff?
- Do you think you know the kind of photos/videos it's ok to share with friends?

 You never know where something could end up so don't share anything you wouldn't be embarrassed for your grandparent to see!
- What kind of photos or videos do you think it's not good to send to anyone?

Embarrassing ones, ones in bed, ones wearing your school uniform, or when you're not fully dressed.

Also ones with personal things in the background like a family photo or the street you live in.

- Would you send a selfie or a video of yourself to someone you didn't know even if they seemed nice?
 - Sometimes people aren't who they say they are and are being nice to get something from you. Check with me.
- Do you think your friends understand that the things you share are just for them?

You have to be really careful who you trust, they might not have been taught about safe sharing.

TIME FOR MORE?




ΜΑΚΕ Δ ΡΔΟΤ

- Let's agree to not share anything online we wouldn't mind someone like a grandparent seeing.
- Let's agree to never share personal photos or our personal details like full name or address with people we don't know and trust.
- Let's tell each other right away if we share something we feel we shouldn't have.



WATCH OUT



READ BEFORE YOU BUILD

Kids don't always know who to trust and can struggle to recognise when someone's not being truthful about who they are and what they want.

It's good to establish that if your child is contacted by a stranger online, they should always check with you before replying.



Lots of apps and sites will set your profile to public automatically. Luckily you can easily change your privacy settings.

BUILD AND TALK

- Do you know what to do If you get a message from a stranger?
- Has it ever happened to you or a friend?
- Why do you think it's important not to reply?

If you really want something, let's discuss it together!

How do you think you can tell if someone isn't who they say they are?

It's really hard to tell. Sometimes grown-ups pretend to be kids.

Do you know what to do if a stranger asks you to do anything that makes you feel uncomfortable?

If they ask you to share a photo of yourself or to meet up with them in real-life, without your parents- don't do it. Tell me or a grown-up you trust.

Has anyone you know (not a stranger) asked you to share photos of yourself or do things that don't feel right?

If it doesn't feel right, you don't have to do it. Tell me or a grown-up you trust if you feel uncomfortable.

MAKE A PACT

- Let's tell each other right away if anyone asks us to do or share something that feels wrong.
- Let's agree to not reply to strangers who message us out of the blue, we'll tell each other instead.
- Let's agree that if something happens online you won't keep it to yourself, and even if you don't want to talk to me, you'll tell another grown-up you trust (like a teacher).
