MAKING MEMORIES

As a kid, George Gilliatt loved reading the LEGO magazines and building with LEGO bricks. Today, he's an experienced LEGO designer and got the chance to explore the history of LEGO building with the 90 Years of Play set. Here's some of what he had to say about creating this classic collection:

How did you choose the models for this set?

It was very difficult to decide which 15 models from the tens of thousands of LEGO products we should include in this set. Our hope was that anyone, no matter how old they are, could look at the builds and recognise at least one model.

How long did it take to design this set?


From the initial idea to the product being released, it was about one and a half years!

What challenges did you face?

The most difficult model to design was the Technic Excavator. I wanted to replicate the high level of functionality but with a simple build. I was really struggling to find a piece that worked as the scooping bucket. I tried nearly every LEGO element we have until I eventually stumbled across the mini catapult piece, which worked just perfectly!

Which models were special to you?

The most special model that I got to include in the set was the BIONICLE* Tahu. The BIONICLE theme meant so much to me as a child, with me and my friends roleplaying as BIONICLE heroes every day in the playground at school!
