





Will you help me with one?




SPLENDID!

These helpful creatures come in all shapes and sizes, so no two Clueless Clickers are the same!




Physical characteristics

They carry around a big heart which they give to others to help them


They have **long stretchy arms** to reach out and help as many people as they can


Illustration of typical Clueless Clicker








Below are some questions to ask your little explorer as they build.


Have you ever been asked to share information with someone you don't know? What did you do?


Why do you think it's important to think before sharing information online?

Have you ever come across pop-ups on a website that seemed suspicious? What should you do if it happens again?



What should you do if somebody finds out your password?


What should you do if an app or website asks for your name, address, or age?




Let's take the online explorer's pledge together!
