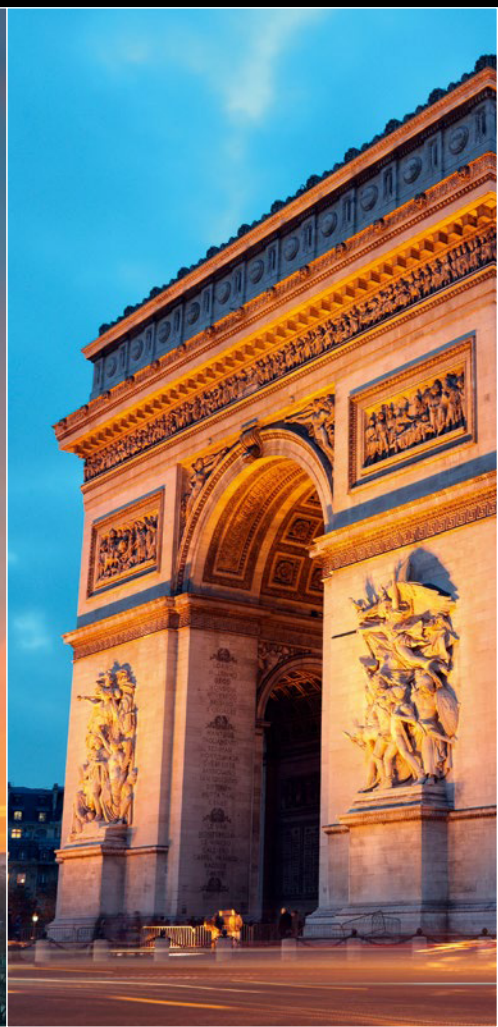
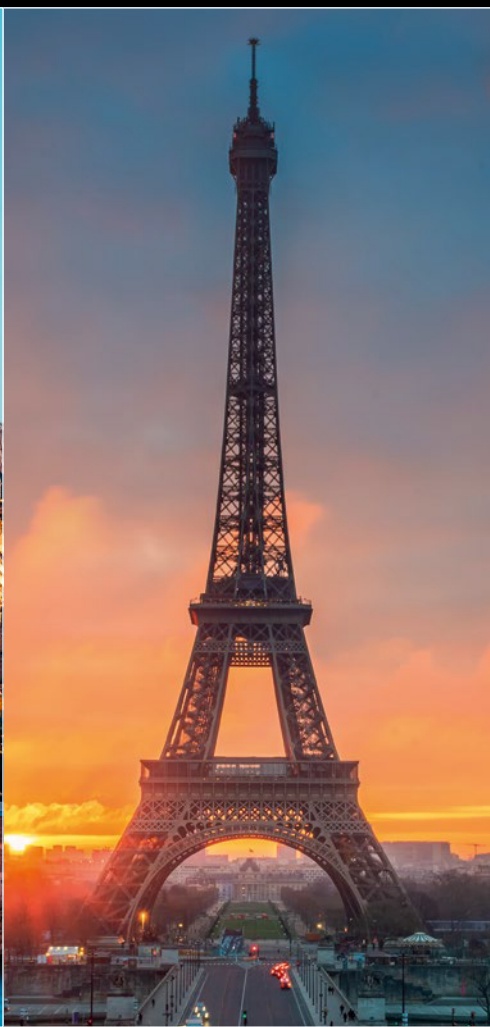

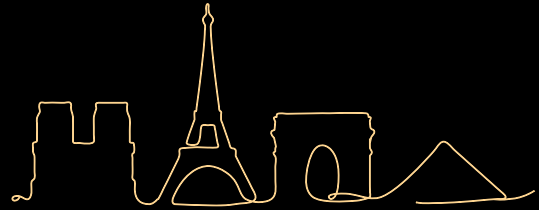
# *City of Love*

For centuries, the French capital has attracted, inspired and nurtured some of history's most renowned artists and architects. Though famously known as the City of Love, this name carries meaning far beyond the ideals of romantic affection. Paris' most iconic landmarks stand as enduring symbols of a deep, collective desire to celebrate bold creative expression, history and timeless beauty. Perhaps the city holds a special place in your heart for its authentic historic charm or its seamless blend of innovation and tradition across art, music and fashion. If you have been there already, we hope this tribute model rekindles fond memories; if you have yet to visit, we hope you enjoy a glimpse of the extraordinary atmosphere this famous city offers.









## *Notre-Dame de Paris*

Construction of Notre-Dame de Paris began in 1163, and the cathedral stands today as a Gothic icon and represents the resilience at the heart of French history. Rebuilt and reopened in 2024, it has survived revolutions, fire and the test of time. The famous cathedral is visited by 15 million people a year.

## *The Eiffel tower*

Built by Gustave Eiffel for the 1889 World's Fair, the 'Iron Lady' stands 300 m (984 ft.) tall and welcomes six million visitors a year. Originally designed to last 20 years, it took just over two years to build. Its distinctive silhouette has long since become a global icon of France.

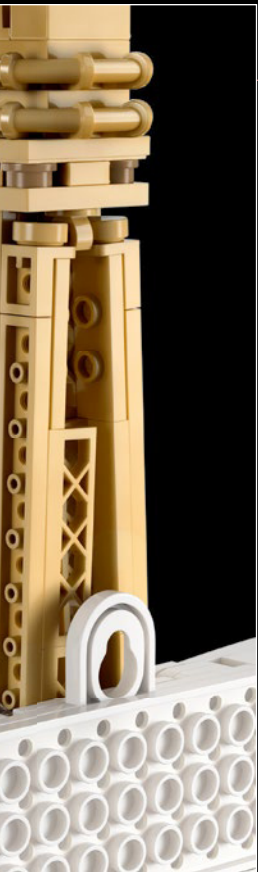
## *The Arc de Triomphe*

Commissioned by Napoleon in 1806 and finished in 1836, the Arc de Triomphe honours French armies past and present. Beneath it lies the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, making it both a symbol of triumph and a solemn site of national remembrance.

## *The Louvre*

Open to everyone since 1793, the Louvre is today one of the world's greatest museums. Born out of the French Revolution and heir to significant royal collections, this former palace of French kings has always reflected and adapted to both national and global history.



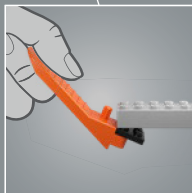
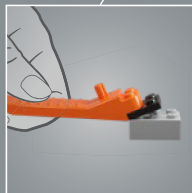
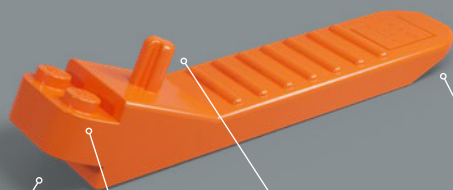

## *Design Team*

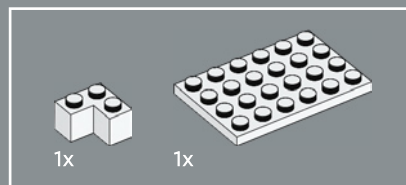
This model seeks to capture the emotion and aesthetic of Paris in a beautiful home decor display piece, as an artistic representation of some of the city's most famous landmarks. Combined with characteristic Parisian city buildings and skyline silhouettes, it creates a charming and immersive scene. If you are familiar with LEGO® Architecture models, this set offers a new twist on our Skyline series. Landmark structures are still captured with a high level of detail, yet here the focus is more on creating an overall scene and atmosphere than on strictly adhering to real life. Given the small scale, we experimented with different elements to find the perfect LEGO pieces to represent different details. The further back you go in the model, the smaller the scale, giving the scene a sense of depth (trees framing the street, for instance). Different sections of the model are layered together to create the illusion of depth despite a shallow footprint. Because the model is made up of small sections for each featured structure, all of which are contained within the display frame, you can build sections individually and see everything come together like a jigsaw puzzle – or a 3D postcard.







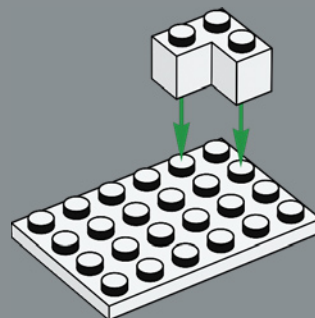
